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Course Descriptions

BIBL 1301 Old Testament Survey (3 semester hours) Foundational issues of Old Testament history and interpretation; consideration given to the entire Old Testament.

**Course serves as a prerequisite toward the Master of Arts in Ministry.*

BIBL 1302 New Testament Survey (3 semester hours) Life and teachings of Jesus in the Gospels, expansion of early Christianity in Acts, teachings of the Pauline Epistles, General Epistles, and Revelation.

**Course serves as a prerequisite toward the Master of Arts in Ministry.*

BIBL 1304 Methods in Biblical Interpretation (3 semester hours) Introduction to biblical analysis, canonicity, transmission, and interpretation. **Prerequisite: Co-enrollment in THEO 1102.**

**Course serves as a prerequisite toward the Master of Arts in Ministry.*

CHST 1301 Introduction to Christianity (3 semester hours) Major historical and theological developments from the first century to present.

**Course serves as a prerequisite toward the Master of Arts in Ministry.*

MNST 2301 Spiritual Formation (3 semester hours) Experiential study of factors impacting formation of a minister's spiritual life; development of a ministry of spiritual direction in the church.

THEO 1102 Theological Research and Writing (1 semester hour) Introduction to theological research and writing skills; emphasis on choosing and narrowing a topic, utilizing theological library resources, implementation of research, note taking, organizing a paper, and writing improvement; use of Turabian, *A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses, and Dissertations*. **Prerequisite: Co-enrollment in BIBL 1304.**

THEO 1301 Introduction to Christian Thought (3 semester hours) A survey of the topical and historical key teachings of the Christian tradition such as the Trinity, nature of Christ, and salvation.

**Course serves as a prerequisite toward the Master of Arts in Ministry.*

THEO 1302 Introduction to Christian Ethics (3 semester hours) Examination of key aspects of Christian moral theology including virtues, the role of scripture, and the church, and exploration of key topics in areas such as politics, sexuality, medicine, and economics.

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Course Descriptions

BIBL 2302/4303 Old Testament Prophets (3 semester hours; Diploma/Bachelor) Intensive study of the books of: Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, and the twelve minor prophets. Attention is given to the background, content, and interpretation of each book. **Prerequisites: BIBL 1304 or consent of instructor.**

CHST/MNST 5304 Legacy and History of the Black Church (3 semester hours; Bachelor) Examines and interprets the history of the Black Church. The role of the Black Church in the Black community will be emphasized along with the contributions to and distinctives within American Protestantism that the Black Church offers.

FOUN 2201/MNST 4301 Capstone (Diploma-2 semester hours; Bachelor-3 semester hours) Overview of the knowledge expected of graduating students in the major and may also address employment and opportunities for continuing their education. Taken in the student's last semester of the Diploma or Bachelor program.

GREK 4302 (3 semester hours; Bachelor) Review of forms. Syntax, prose compositions, and special selections from the New Testament. **Prerequisite: GREK 2401, 2402.**

LEAD 1301 Foundations of Leadership (3 semester hours; Diploma) Theories; ethics, values, character development, diversity, and behavior.

MNST 2311/4311 History of Missions (3 semester hours; Diploma/Bachelor) Study of the rise and development of missions from the time of Christ through the modern missionary movement until the present. Emphasis will be given to outstanding missionaries and movements.

MNST 2323 Principles of Christian Worship (3 semester hours; Diploma) Study of the public worship experience of the church - the theological/historical foundations and its practical expression.

MNST 3343 Introduction to Evangelism (3 semester hours; Bachelor) Intensive study of evangelism and its message including methods particularly related to the educational organizations.

MNST 4370 Christian Worship (3 semester hours; Bachelor) Study of the public worship experience within the church. Attention will be given to the theological foundation of worship, its historical antecedents and practical expression.

MNST 5303 Ministering to the Margins (3 semester hours; Bachelor) A study of the ministerial, theological, philosophical, and ethical insight to bear upon contemporary moral and cultural issues for marginalized groups.

Course Descriptions

BIBL 6304 The Pentateuch (3 semester hours; Graduate) Intensive study of the first five books of the Old Testament. Attention is given to the background, content, and interpretation of each book. **Prerequisite: BIBL 6340 or consent of instructor.**

BIBL 6344 Interpreting the NT II (3 semester hours; Graduate) Continued introduction to the interpretation of the New Testament focusing on background issues, interpretive methodologies, biblical content, and theological implications for the church.

Prerequisite: BIBL 6340.

CHST/MNST 6304 Legacy and History of the Black Church (3 semester hours; Graduate) Examines and interprets the history of the Black Church. The role of the Black Church in the Black community will be emphasized along with the contributions to and distinctives within American Protestantism that the Black Church offers.

MNST 6101 Capstone (1 semester hour; Graduate) Overview of the knowledge expected of graduating students in the major and may also address employment and opportunities for continuing their education. Taken in the student's last semester of the Masters Program.

MNST 6303 Ministering to the Margins (3 semester hours; Graduate) A study of the ministerial, theological, philosophical, and ethical insight to bear upon contemporary moral and cultural issues for marginalized groups.

MY STORY: ERIC TARVER

Eric Tarver is the Pastor of Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church in Beeville, Texas.

After graduating high school, many of my friends went straight to college. My path was a little different.

A fellow pastor introduced me to SCS and "forced" me to take classes, and after taking a single class, it felt like God had lit something within me. Before I knew it, I completed my Certificate in Ministry, and I was not finished nor satisfied. I had to keep going.

After completing my Diploma in Ministry, I was able to transfer my credit hours to complete my undergraduate degree with another Texas Baptist college.

Dr. Gonzalez-Moreno first felt called to teaching when she received her Bachelor of Arts in Religious Studies and English from The University of Texas at Austin. This calling matured as she pursued a Master of Arts in Theological Studies from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary and a Doctorate in Theological Studies from Regent University where she wrote her dissertation about the significance of the “ostrich” and war horse in the animal discourse of Job 38:39 – 39:30. Her area of expertise is the Old Testament, especially the “Divine Speeches” in the book of Job including the role of Leviathan and Behemoth.

“I greatly enjoy deep theological discussions with students and witnessing that ‘aha’ moment that happens when students realize something that they had not previously considered,” says Dr. Gonzalez-Moreno.
